Proposal Review Committee Report

April 17, 2023 Preliminary Draft

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Introduction

The Central Coast Commission for Senior Citizens, Area Agency on Aging, issued three (3) Requests for Proposals (RFP) on April 1, 2022. The RFPs solicited proposals for the provision of Title III C: Elder Nutrition Program, Title IIID Health Promotion services, and Title III E Family Caregiver Respite Care services for the period July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024.

The resulting contract(s) will be a one- year contract with three option years for services that are subject to renewal annually at the discretion of the AAA Board of Directors, and subject to satisfactory performance of all contract requirements and annual appropriations. Applications (proposals) were received in response to the RFP's.

All Applications for Funding received were forwarded to the Proposal Review Committee for review. In conformance with its Area Plan, the Area Agency on Aging provides contract awards through the Title III/VII (federal funds) to agencies for the provision of services in the two-county (San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara) area. The Area Agency on Aging accomplishes this through multi-year RFP's.

A Proposal Review Committee has been designated by the Area Agency on Aging to be responsible for the review and evaluation of all applications and the development of recommendations to be presented to the Area Agency on Aging Board of Directors. The Agency policy states that the Proposal Review Committee consists of members from the Area Agency on Aging Advisory Council and the Board of Directors. This year the AAA Advisory Council volunteer was Dorothy Schlitz. The Proposal Review Committee members from the Board of Directors was Sharon Whitney, Nancy Crawford and Jean McKinnon.

Following the public hearing on the preliminary recommendations, the Proposal Review Committee members present met and determined that based on the comments no changes to the preliminary recommendations were needed.

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The criteria used by the Proposal Review Committee were outlined in detail in each Request for Proposal.

The awarding of contracts is contingent upon the receipt of sufficient monies and a Notification of Contract Award from the California Department of Aging to the Central Coast Commission for Senior Citizens, and upon the regulations of the Older Americans Act. The budget information for 2023/24 was received after the Proposal Review Committee developed their recommendations. A quick review indicates that there are sufficient monies to fund the recommendations.

The Older Americans Act makes funds available for the provision of home and community-based services. These services provided through Title III are to be targeted to older persons in greatest social and economic need. For the purpose of these RFPs and subaward, a senior is defined as a person aged 60 years of age or older. Greatest social need means the need caused by noneconomic factors that restrict an individual's ability to perform normal daily tasks or that threaten his or her capacity to live independently. These factors include physical and mental disability, language barriers, and cultural or social isolation caused by, among other things, racial and ethnic status, sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression. Any senior whose income is estimated to be equal to or less than the current SSI/SSP benefit level shall be counted as having the greatest economic need.

Section I Title III C- Elder Nutrition Program

Title IIIC: Congregate Nutrition

\$687,775. for the provision of a minimum 91,703 meals to a minimum 350 senior citizens at the congregate nutrition sites in Santa Maria, Lompoc, Santa Barbara, Goleta, and Carpinteria. The service provider must provide nutrition education.

\$ 1,504. for the provision of 56 sessions of nutrition education presentations (provided quarterly) to 600 senior citizens at the congregate nutrition sites in Santa Barbara County.

Title IIIC Home Delivered Nutrition

\$ 466,650. for the provision of a minimum 89,000 meals to a minimum 350 senior citizens in Santa Barbara County. The service provider must provide nutrition education.

Options

No Applications for Funding were received.

Options available:

- 1. Release another RFP;
- 2. Allocate no funds;
- 3. Provide services in each County as a direct service; or
- 4. Transfer the funding for the provision of nutrition services.

Section III Title III D- Health Promotion & Disease Prevention

RFP information \$40,000 for the provision of an evidence-based health promotion program, including programs related to the prevention and mitigation of the effects of chronic disease (including, but not limited to, osteoporosis, obesity, diabetes, and cardiovascular disease), alcohol and substance abuse reduction, smoking cessation, weight loss and control, stress management, falls prevention, physical activity, and improved nutrition.

Options

No Applications for Funding were received. One organization submitted a letter of intent. However, they were not able to complete the application in time.

Options available:

- 1. Release another RFP;
- 2. Allocate no funds;
- 3. Provide services in each County as a direct service; or
- 4. Transfer the funding for the provision of nutrition services.

Section IV: Title III E- Family Caregiver Respite Care

RFP information

\$145,565 for the provision of respite care for family caregivers. Respite care is the provision of care receiver services by an appropriately skilled provider or volunteer in order to prevent wandering and health or safety incidents in the instance when an eligible caregiver is not present.

Applicant: Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital- Coast Caregiver Resource Center (CCRC)

Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital- Coast Caregiver Resource Center (CCRC) is the point of entry to local supportive services available to nonpaid family members, ages 18 and older, caring for adults with adult-onset brain impairments and other adults with disabling conditions. Services include case management, respite care, support groups, mental health counseling. CCRC is one of 11 regional nonprofit Caregiver Resource Centers that serve the estimated 5.5 million unpaid family and friend caregivers across the State of California.

CCRC has provided FCSP respite since January 2009. Through January of this fiscal year, CCRC has vouchered 2,482 of the respite hours available (62%) – including OTO units – and allotted the remaining 38% for use through June 30, 2023 (e.g., 1,497 hours).

CCRC is proposing a budget of \$145,565 for the provision of 3,229 hours of respite care services for 90 family caregivers. CCRC will continue to provide various forms of caregiver respite support (in-home supervision, homemaker assistance, in-home personal care, and out-of-home day care) through contracted service providers in both Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo Counties.

Recommendation- The committee recommends the Board approve the award **of** \$145,565 for the provision of 3,229 hours of respite care services for 90 family caregivers.
